### Midterm Election Stakes

#### National:

- 37 Senate seats
- 435 Congressional seats

#### State:

- 37 Gubernatorial seats
- 160 statewide ballot measures in 37 states
- 6,000+ General Assembly seats





# Midterm Elections: Voter Participation

"We in America do not have government by the majority, we have government by the majority who participate."

- ~42% in 2010
- 63% in 2008
   (highest since 1960)
- 37% in 2006
- 55% in 2004
- 36% in 2002



### Midterm Elections: US Senate

- Democrats
  - 52 seats
- Republicans
  - o 46 seats
  - 6 pick-ups: AR, IL, IN, ND,PA & WI (none in the SE)
- Independents
  - (2 w/in Dem total)
  - Murkowski (AK) may prevail and caucus with Reps
- 2 seats still undecided: WA & AK





### Midterm Elections: US House

#### Republicans

- 239 seats +60 seats
- SE pick-ups: 1 in AL; 4 in FL; 1 in GA; 2 in MS; 1 in NC\*; 1 in SC; 3 in TN; 2 in VA;

#### Democrats

- o 186 seats
- 0 SE pick-ups loss of21 Blue Dog seats
- 10 seats still undecided
  - o 7 leaning Dem
  - o 3 leaning Rep



\* NC-02 may recount as margin is > 1%



# Midterm Elections: Governorships

#### Republicans

- 29 governor seats
- *SE pick-up*: TN, FL\*
- Democrats
  - 16 governor seats
  - No SE pick-ups
- Independents
  - 1 seat pick up in RI
- 4 still undecided
  - o CT, IL MN, and VT





<sup>\*</sup> FL was counted as Independent

- 19 Chambers changed control
- In the SE:
  - AL, NC
  - GOP controls
     18/28 Chambers

# 112<sup>th</sup> Congress Overview

#### **Senate**

- •Republicans 46
  - *In the SE 13*
- •Democrats 51
  - ■In the SE 4
- •Independents 3
  - ■None in the SE
  - 2 caucus with Ds



#### **House of Representatives**

- Republicans 243
  - *In the SE 63\**
- Democrats 192
  - In the SE 27



\* 2 of these new members would be permitted to join the progressive-leaning Congressional Black Caucus based on African ancestry



# Midterm Elections: By the Numbers

- 80% of Dems who supported the climate bill won races
- 75% of GOP who supported the climate bill won races or were promoted
- 62% of Dems who voted against the climate bill lost races or saw retiring seats flip to the GOP
- 9% of all voters were age 18 to 29, compared with 19% in 2008
- 25% of the Dem caucus was defeated which equaled 60% of the land area they represented



# Midterm Elections: By the Numbers (cntd)

- O African-Americans will serve in the Senate
- \$454 million spent on U.S. House & Senate races
- 5 times more was spent by outside groups in 2010 than in 2006
- ~2 in 3 voters rejected an attempt to roll back California's global warming law



# Midterm Elections: Implications for 112<sup>th</sup>

#### Climate and Energy Legislation

- "Find broad areas of agreement"
  - Natural Gas, Energy Efficiency, Electric Vehicles and Renewable Technologies
- American Energy Act from Speaker-elect Boehner?
- Conflict? Tea Party fiscal goals vs. \$\$ energy subsidies to coal, oil and nuclear

- Climate and Energy-related Committees
  - Leadership changes
    - House Energy Chair Barton or Upton?
    - House Select Committee to continue?
    - Senate Energy RMM depends on AK race
  - Committee investigations


#### Climate and Energy Regulation

- EPA has a legal obligation to regulate carbon pollution → human health impacts
- Legislative threats to EPA are likely– "Dirty Air Act"
- Coal ash regulatory decision expected in 2011-12
