



Clean Energy Tennessee Report

- 70% of renewable energy firms were solar
- 151 companies
- 2,200 employees

In 2014, Tennessee was one of 4 states to supply 100% of new electrical capacity with solar!






About 70% of renewable technology firms indicated that solar generates significant business. Bioenergy and geothermal represent a sizeable portion of business at roughly 27% and 25%, respectively. About 19% of firms reported working with hydropower or hydrokinetic technologies (Figure 4).

Incentives for Solar

Federal Investment Tax Credit

- 30% tax credit for residential and commercial solar installations
- In effect until Dec. 31, 2016
 - ➤ after 2016 the commercial incentive drops to 10% and the residential drops to zero UNLESS Congress extends benefit
- Company that installs, develops or finances project uses the credit OR residential owner applies it to his/her income taxes

Department of Energy Incentives

- More than \$52 million to support 22 new projects aimed at making solar more accessible and affordable across the nations
- \$50 million towards improving solar technology past the goals of the SunShot Initiative

TVA Service Territory

TVA's Allen Coal Plant

- The Tennessee Valley Authority is our nation's largest public power provider serving 7 states.
- TVA sells power to Local Power Providers like Memphis Light, Gas and Water, which is TVA's largest customer!

TVA and Solar

Green Power Switch

- Additional charge on utility bill
- \$4 per 150 kWh of clean energy added to TVA system

Green Power Providers


- Maximum size of 50kW
- TVA purchases 100% of the energy output
- \$1,000 incentive available for eligible residential customers

Renewable Standard Offer

- Locks in a long term contract price
- Available for systems greater than 50kW and less than 20 MW

Solar Solutions Initiative

- Incentive payments for mid-size solar projects in TVA's Renewable Standard Offer Program if the projects use local NABCEP-certified installers in the Valley region
- 20 MW total 12 MW (200kW-1MW); 4 MW (51kW-200kW); 4 MW for LPC



What's Next for Solar?

Clean Power Plan

- First ever regulations to limit carbon dioxide emissions from fossil-fueled power plants
- Relies on a federal-state partnership structure to reduce carbon pollution
- ♦ Sets source specific emission standards
- Includes a Clean Energy Incentive Program (CEIP) to spur growth of renewable energy and low-income energy efficiency



✓ Memphis could benefit from the CEIP by creating jobs, cleaning up our air and earning marketable carbon dioxide emission credits to sell to other industries



Served as President of ULICO from 1983 - 1985






















LOWER LEVEL PLAN





FIRST FLOOR PLAN






